25 1. I am one of the plaintiffs in this action. I have personal knowledge of the facts
26 set forth in this declaration and am fully competent to testify in this matter.

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1 2. I am presently employed as Operations Manager at Goodwill Industries of the
2 Columbia, Inc. in Kennewick, Washington. I work at a Goodwill warehouse in Pasco.

3 3. I am a gay man, and I have been in a romantic relationship with plaintiff Curt
4 Freed since 2004.

5 4. Curt proposed marriage to me in December 2012 and we made plans to marry
6 on our anniversary in September 2013.

7 5. We were excited about organizing our wedding and planned to buy flowers for
8 the wedding from Arlene's Flowers. We had purchased flowers from Arlene's Flowers many
9 times over the years, and we considered Arlene's Flowers to be our florist. In the last five
10 years, I can recall making only one or two floral purchases from other sources.

11 6. After work on February 28, 2013, I drove in my car to Arlene's Flowers from
12 my workplace in downtown Pasco to speak to someone about floral arrangements for our
13 wedding. I told Janell Becker that Curt and I were getting married and that we wanted
14 Arlene's to do the flowers. Ms. Becker informed me that I would have to speak to the owner,
15 Barronelle Stutzman. I asked for Ms. Stutzman's schedule, which Ms. Becker wrote on a
16 scrap of paper.

17 7. During my lunch hour on March 1, 2013, I drove in my car to Arlene's
18 Flowers to speak with Barronelle Stutzman about ordering flowers for my wedding to Curt. I
19 had ordered flowers from Ms. Stutzman many times, including flowers for Curt's birthday
20 and our anniversary.

21 8. I told Ms. Stutzman that Curt and I were getting married and that we would
22 like Arlene's to do the flowers. Ms. Stutzman took my hand and said that she could not do
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1 the flowers because of her relationship with Jesus Christ. I was in complete and utter shock
2 by what she said, but to be polite, I asked whether she knew any florists who would do our
3 flowers. Ms. Stutzman gave me the names of three other florists in the area.
4

5 9. After my conversation with Ms. Stutzman, I left Arlene's Flowers, returned to
6 my car, and drove back to my work, and eventually my home in Kennewick, empty handed.
7

8 10. I own my car and buy the gas that is consumed by driving my car.
9

10 11. The refusal sent Curt and me reeling. We stopped planning for a wedding in
11 September 2013 because we feared being denied service by other wedding vendors. We were
12 shocked and saddened by the refusal and took some time to decide how to respond.
13

14 12. Curt and I felt that our friends and family should know about the refusal and
15 we shared our story on Facebook. Word of the refusal spread widely. Friends and strangers
16 contacted us with florist recommendations, referrals, and offers.
17

18 13. Curt and I gave much heartwrenching thought to whether we should do
19 something in response to the discrimination we encountered at Arlene's Flowers. We
20 ultimately decided to contact attorneys and inquire about commencing a legal action.
21

22 14. Also, we obviously needed to make alternative arrangements to buy flowers
23 for our wedding. After taking time to consider our options, we decided to buy flowers from
24 two other sources: Carol Travis and Lucky Flowers in Kennewick. Carol had offered her
25 floral services to us after learning of the refusal and was supportive of our relationship. I
26 made the arrangements with Carol by phone and text message and drove my car to Carol's
27 home in Kennewick to pick up the boutonnieres and corsages we purchased from her. Curt
28 bought an arrangement from Lucky Flowers.

15. Curt and I were married in a small ceremony at our home on July 21, 2013.

1 **Interrogatories**

2 **Interrogatory No. 33:** Please identify each person who assisted you in preparing your
3 answers and responses to these discovery requests.

4 **Answer:** Curt Freed and our legal counsel.
5

6 **Interrogatory No. 34:** If you know, please describe with particularity the type of floral
7 arrangement you planned to purchase from Arlene's Flowers for your September wedding.

8 **Answer:** When I visited Arlene's Flowers on March 1, I did not know with
9 particularity what Curt and I wanted to purchase from Arlene's Flowers for our wedding. We
10 had an idea that we wanted something simple and beach themed. This might have included
11 something as simple as slender branches in vases. Curt and I even considered that we might
12 arrange such branches and vases ourselves if we purchased them from Arlene's and did not
13 want help arranging them. We did not make any final decisions, however, because my
14 conversation with Ms. Stutzman focused on her decision not to serve us. Ms. Stutzman and I
15 did not discuss in any detail the types of goods or services Curt and I wanted Arlene's to
16 provide.
17

18 **Interrogatory No. 35:** If you knew at the time you met with Ms. Stutzman on or about
19 March 1, please explain whether you intended to hire Ms. Stutzman or Arlene's Flowers to
20 arrange flowers for your wedding or you planned to purchase the floral products and arrange
21 them without the assistance of Arlene's Flowers or Barronelle Stutzman.

22 **Answer:** Please see my Answer to Interrogatory No. 34.
23

24 **Interrogatory No. 36:** Are you claiming that any physical, mental or emotional injuries were
25 caused by Barronelle Stutzman or Arlene's Flowers? If so, please state with particularity your
26 understanding of the injury caused, the specific facts supporting your claim, whether you have
27 recovered from such injury, the specific treatment received related to your injuries, the
28

1 amount in damages you seek for the injury, and the name, address, and telephone number of
2 anyone with information related to the injury.

3 **Answer:** Although I was injured in many ways by the discrimination we encountered
4 at Arlene's Flowers, I understand this Interrogatory to seek information about money
5 damages, and I am not seeking money damages for any physical, mental, or emotional
6 injuries.

7
8 **Interrogatory No. 37:** If you are claiming damages related to finding an alternative source of
9 flowers for your wedding, please identify the specific amount in damages including time and
10 expense that you claim were caused by Arlene's Flowers or Barronelle Stutzman.

11 **Answer:** The 2013 standard mileage rate for use of a car, as set by the U.S. Internal
12 Revenue Service ([http://www.irs.gov/uac/Newsroom/2013-Standard-Mileage-Rates-Up-1-](http://www.irs.gov/uac/Newsroom/2013-Standard-Mileage-Rates-Up-1-Cent-per-Mile-for-Business,-Medical-and-Moving)
13 [Cent-per-Mile-for-Business,-Medical-and-Moving](http://www.irs.gov/uac/Newsroom/2013-Standard-Mileage-Rates-Up-1-Cent-per-Mile-for-Business,-Medical-and-Moving)), was \$0.565 per mile driven. I made three
14 trips related to finding flowers for my wedding to Curt Freed. The first was from my place of
15 employment in Pasco to Arlene's in Richland, and then home. The second was from my
16 place of employment to Arlene's, then back to work again. The third was from my home in
17 Kennewick to Carol Travis's home in Kennewick, then back again to my home. Curt Freed
18 took one trip related to finding flowers for our wedding. He drove from our home in
19 Kennewick to Lucky Flowers and then home again. Only two of these trips would have been
20 made had Arlene's accepted our business: one trip to place an order, and one trip to pick
21 flowers up (which we probably would have done, even though we might have had the flowers
22 delivered). Our trips to Carol Travis's home and Lucky Flowers would therefore have been
23 unnecessary. The round trip distance from our home (3003 W. 47th Ave., Kennewick, WA)
24 to Carol Travis's home (3904 S. Vancouver St., Kennewick, WA) is approximately two miles.
25 Two miles, multiplied by \$0.565, equals \$1.13. The round trip distance from our home to
26 Lucky Flowers (6827 W. Clearwater Ave., Kennewick, WA) is approximately twelve miles.
27 Twelve miles, multiplied by \$0.565, equals \$6.78. Accordingly, we seek \$7.91 in out-of-
28 pocket monetary damages related to finding alternative sources of flowers for our wedding.

1 We also seek damages, in an amount to be determined by the Court or jury, relating to
2 the time and inconvenience associated with deciding on alternative sources of flowers for our
3 wedding.

6 **Interrogatory No. 38:** Are there any other damages not previously identified herein that you
7 attribute to the actions of Arlene's Flowers or Barronelle Stutzman? If so, please state for each
8 item the nature, the date it occurred, the amount, and the name, address, and telephone
9 number of each person with knowledge of the claimed damage.

10 **Answer:** Although I was injured in many ways by the discrimination we encountered
11 at Arlene's Flowers, I understand this Interrogatory to seek information about money
12 damages, and I am not seeking money damages for any injuries other than what is described
13 in my response to Interrogatory 37.

5 A. Again, I don't recall that conversation completely.
6 I do know that I did get some other florists
7 provided to me by Barronelle.

8 Q. Did Barronelle tell you during that conversation
9 that she was referring you because of her
10 relationship with Jesus Christ?

11 A. She did not use those words exactly, as I recall.
12 she was not going to do them because of her
13 relationship with Jesus Christ, but other florists
14 were given to me as an option.

15 Q. And that is the reason that she gave you, correct?

16 A. That would be a correct statement, yes.

17 Q. The next sentence says, "I understand that on a
18 political and religious basis and it is their right
19 to do so," do you see that? Was that your
20 understanding as well, that you understood she was
21 referring you because of her religion and you
22 understood at that time that she had the right to do
23 so?

24 A. Upon having the conversation with Barronelle, I was
25 initially shocked and my response was not -- It was

1 a response of I don't understand and I walked away
2 feeling very hurt and upset emotionally because I
3 didn't understand why this person that I had
4 developed a relationship with would do this to me,
5 so that would be my answer.

6 Q. But at the time and when you left the store, you
7 didn't believe that it was illegal for her to refer
8 you, correct?

9 MR. SCOTT: Objection. Lack of foundation.
10 Calls for a legal opinion of a lay witness.

11 MS. WAGGONER: I think you mean object as to
12 form, correct?

13 MR. SCOTT: No, I mean what I said, Counsel.

14 MS. WAGGONER: Well, I encourage you to stick
15 with objecting to form --

16 MR. SCOTT: I'm entitled to make the objection.

17 MS. WAGGONER: -- without coaching the witness.

18 MR. SCOTT: Well, I stand by my objection.

6 because, again, it was a person that I had formed a
7 relationship with and didn't know that that would be
8 the outcome. I also had to go back to work, so my
9 mindset was, I need to go back to work. I need to
10 -- I was in shock and it was like no, I didn't put a
11 lot to it at that point in time.

12 Q. But as you thought about it later you didn't know
13 that it was against the law for her to refer, right?

14 A. After I thought about it, yes, I knew that it was
15 against the law for her to refer -- to not offer me
16 flowers.

17 Q. When did you reach that conclusion?

18 A. That day was my birthday and we had friends that
19 were coming over for dinner and when I had gotten
20 home from work, Curt was preparing dinner for me and
21 we had guests coming and I said to him, "By the
22 way" -- something to this effect, I can't be a
23 hundred percent -- "Barronelle is not going to do
24 flowers for our wedding because of her belief in
25 Jesus Christ and it's against her religion to do

1 Q. And what was that?

2 A. Just some sticks or twigs in a vase and then we were
3 going to do candles. We wanted to be very simple
4 and understated.

5 Q. Did you tell Barronelle that you wanted to do sticks
6 or twigs?

7 A. Barronelle never gave me the opportunity to discuss
8 the flower arrangements.

9 Q. And if you were just doing sticks or twigs for your
10 wedding arrangement, why did you drive all the way
11 over to Arlene's Flowers to put together sticks and
12 twigs?

13 A. Barronelle was our florist, we'd used her for
14 awhile, and we knew that she would be able to get
15 the things that we wanted.

16 Q. And you believed she would use her creativity to
17 create something beautiful?

18 A. I did not at that time believe that we would have
19 had her create them rather than to source them.

20 Q. By source them, do you just mean purchase the
21 product?

22 A. Yes, that's what I mean.

23 Q. Premade?

24 A. Sticks and twigs aren't premade. You cut them.

25 Q. So they would need to be arranged, right?

1 A. I don't believe that she would have arranged them
2 for us. We would have purchased vases and perhaps
3 just put them on the table with some candles around
4 them.

5 Q. Did you bring any pictures in when you went to meet
6 with Barronelle?

7 A. I did not.

8 Q. Are you aware whether Curt had any contact with
9 Barronelle about the wedding arrangements?

10 A. I do not believe that Curt had any contact with
11 Barronelle.

12 Q. In the nine years that Barronelle served you, was
13 her referral for your wedding the only time she
14 declined to create an arrangement for you?

15 A. That was the only time that she refused to serve us,
16 yes.

17 Q. Curt asked you to marry him, right?

18 A. Yes, he did.

19 Q. When did he propose to you?

20 A. In December of 2012.

21 Q. When did you originally plan to get married?

22 A. Our anniversary, which is September 19th.

23 Q. Where did you plan to hold the ceremony?

24 A. A place called Bella Fiori Gardens.

25 Q. What did you like about Bella Fiori Gardens?

1 A. We knew the owners and it was a really nice venue.

2 Q. What appealed to you about the venue?

3 A. It was quiet and private. It had the space we
4 needed. It was outdoors.

5 Q. How many guests did you plan on inviting?

6 A. A hundred plus.

7 Q. Did you plan to send wedding invitations?

8 A. Yes, we did.

9 Q. Did you plan to use a guestbook at the ceremony?

10 A. Yes, we did.

11 Q. Did you plan to have a licensed or ordained minister
12 marry you at that ceremony?

13 A. Yes, we did.

14 Q. Did you plan to have a dinner or reception for the
15 ceremony?

16 A. Yes, we did.

17 Q. Did you plan to exchange vows at the ceremony?

18 A. Yes, we did.

19 Q. How about rings?

20 A. Yes, we did.

21 Q. Did you plan to have a photographer at the ceremony?

22 A. Yes, we did.

23 Q. And a caterer?

24 A. Yes, we did.

25 Q. And a wedding cake?

1 A. Yes, we did.

2 Q. Did you plan to purchase boutonnières for the
3 wedding?

4 A. Yes, we did.

5 Q. Did you plan to purchase floral arrangements to use
6 as perhaps seating markers or end-of-the-row


