

How to Find School Discipline Data: Behaviors and Length of Exclusion

Washington's Office of Superintendent of Public Instruction publishes data on student discipline in every school district in the state. If you have the Microsoft Excel program, you can download the data and review it. To find the data:

Step 1: Go to <http://www.k12.wa.us/DataAdmin/PerformanceIndicators/DataAnalytics.aspx#discipline>

Step 2: Scroll down to number 13 in the table, and click on 13.Discipline

- b) What percentage of suspension and expulsion in your district is due to non-violent behaviors, such as disruptive conduct, failure to cooperate, or “other behavior”?
- c) Are students of color disproportionately suspended or expelled for non-violent behaviors, such as disruptive conduct, failure to cooperate, or “other behavior”?
- d) How many instructional days did students in your school district lose to suspension and expulsion?
