I am currently serving in the Unites States Air Force Reserves. I previously served as a member of the 40th/446th AES. I have served with Major Witt. 21 I am gay or lesbian. My close friends in the 40th/446th AES that I socialized with 22 3. 23 knew that I was gay or lesbian because I expressly confirmed it, and I was often present with my partner at social events. I believe that at least twenty other members in the 40th/446th AES knew 24 25 that I was gay or lesbian. Other unit members also may or may not have known. I believe that 26 Colonel Moore-Harbert knew of my sexual orientation because she saw me with my partner on

various occasions. She never expressed any problem with us. My sexual orientation has never given rise to any problems in my service in the 40th/446th AES; it has been a non-issue. Nobody cared.

- 4. I have deployed overseas. On deployment, I never experienced any problems caused by my sexual orientation. My sexual orientation was only relevant at moments when I was approached by individuals of the opposite sex, who wanted to have sex and commit adultery. Many of my heterosexual peers engaged in adultery on deployment, I believe in part because they feared they might die in the warzone. I did not engage in this behavior.
- 5. I have never heard anyone in the 40th/446th AES say anything about how they did not like gays or lesbians, or that they did not want to serve with gays or lesbians. In my experience, sexual orientation has never been an issue in the 40th/446th.
- 6. Prior to Desert Storm, when there were approximately 300 members in the 40th/446th AES, I believe there were at least 35 gay and lesbian members serving in the unit. I explicitly knew that 15 members were gay or lesbian because they were my friends and we talked about it amongst ourselves when socializing. At present, I suspect that there are at least ten gay or lesbian members. The unit attitude towards gay and lesbian members has always been that sexual orientation is a non-issue. What matters in a person is how well they can be a teamplayer, contribute to esprit de corps, and how well they do their job.
- 7. When I found out that Major Witt was suspended for being a lesbian, I was shocked because she was a great officer and her sexual orientation had never been an issue in the unit. After Major Witt's suspension, I was personally scared that my position in the Air Force might be in danger due to possible future witch hunts.
- 8. I do not think that Major Witt's sexual orientation had any effect on unit cohesion or morale. She would not have been selected to serve as the head of Standardization and Evaluation if her presence negatively impacted our mission. Only the sharpest and the most qualified are selected for this position.

I	9. Major Witt's sexual orientation does not influence my opinion that she is a
2	professional flight nurse and officer, nor does it change the fact that I would welcome her back to
3	the Air Force and work alongside her any day. I believe that her reinstatement would not have a
1	negative impact on unit morale. I make this statement knowing that Major Witt began dating her
5	current partner in late 2003, while her partner was technically still married, but separated from
5	her husband with the intention of being divorced.
