Oral argument will be <u>twenty minutes</u> per side. If a party wishes to request <u>thirty minutes</u> per side for oral argument, the request must be submitted in writing. The Court strongly encourages that, whenever possible, oral argument should be presented by only one-or at most two-counsel per side.

If counsel are aware of any potential amicus curiae, they should be advised RAP 10.2(f)(1), as amended on September 1, 2014, that amicus curiae motions and briefs must be served and received by the Court not later than 45 days <u>before</u> oral argument. (If that date falls on a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday, the motion and or/brief must be received by the proceeding day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday.)

Opinions are usually released at 8:00 a.m. on Thursdays.
