4 the day of service, or a default judgment may be entered against you without notice. A default  
5 judgment is one where plaintiffs are entitled to what has been asked for because you have not  
6 responded. If you serve a notice of appearance on the undersigned person, you are entitled to notice  
7 before a default judgment may be entered.

8 If you wish to seek the advice of any attorney in this matter, you should do so promptly so  
9 that your written response, if any may be served on time.

10 THIS SUMMONS is issued pursuant to Rule 4 of the Superior Court Civil Rules of the  
11 State of Washington.
