
EXPLANATION OF EXEMPTIONS

SUBSECTIONS OF TITLE 5, UNITED STATES CODE, SECTION 552

- (b)(1) (A) specifically authorized under criteria established by an Executive order to be kept secret in the interest of national defense or foreign policy and (B) are in fact properly classified to such Executive order;
- (b)(2) related solely to the internal personnel rules and practices of an agency;
- (b)(3) specifically exempted from disclosure by statute (other than section 552b of this title), provided that such statute(A) requires that the matters be withheld from the public in such a manner as to leave no discretion on issue, or (B) establishes particular criteria for withholding or refers to particular types of matters to be withheld;
- (b)(4) trade secrets and commercial or financial information obtained from a person and privileged or confidential;
- (b)(5) inter-agency or intra-agency memorandums or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency;
- (b)(6) personnel and medical files and similar files the disclosure of which would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy;
- (b)(7) records or information compiled for law enforcement purposes, but only to the extent that the production of such law enforcement records or information (A) could be reasonably be expected to interfere with enforcement proceedings, (B) would deprive a person of a right to a fair trial or an impartial adjudication, (C) could be reasonably expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy, (D) could reasonably be expected to disclose the identity of confidential source, including a State, local, or foreign agency or authority or any private institution which furnished information on a confidential basis, and, in the case of record or information compiled by a criminal law enforcement authority in the course of a criminal investigation, or by an agency conducting a lawful national security intelligence investigation, information furnished by a confidential source, (E) would disclose techniques and procedures for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions, or would disclose guidelines for law enforcement investigations or prosecutions if such disclosure could reasonably be expected to risk circumvention of the law, or (F) could reasonably be expected to endanger the life or physical safety of any individual;
- (b)(8) contained in or related to examination, operating, or condition reports prepared by, on behalf of, or for the use of an agency responsible for the regulation or supervision of financial institutions; or
- (b)(9) geological and geophysical information and data, including maps, concerning wells.

- (d)(5) information compiled in reasonable anticipation of a civil action proceeding;
- (j)(2) material reporting investigative efforts pertaining to the enforcement of criminal law including efforts to prevent, control, or reduce crime or apprehend criminals;
- (k)(1) information which is currently and properly classified pursuant to an Executive order in the interest of the national defense or foreign policy, for example, information involving intelligence sources or methods;
- (k)(2) investigatory material compiled for law enforcement purposes, other than criminal, which did not result in loss of a right, benefit or privilege under Federal programs, or which would identify a source who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(3) material maintained in connection with providing protective services to the President of the United States or any other individual pursuant to the authority of Title 18, United States Code, Section 3056;
- (k)(4) required by statute to be maintained and used solely as statistical records;
- (k)(5) investigatory material compiled solely for the purpose of determining suitability, eligibility, or qualifications for Federal civilian employment or for access to classified information, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished information pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence;
- (k)(6) testing or examination material used to determine individual qualifications for appointment or promotion in Federal Government service the release of which would compromise the testing or examination process;
- (k)(7) material used to determine potential for promotion in the armed services, the disclosure of which would reveal the identity of the person who furnished the material pursuant to a promise that his/her identity would be held in confidence.

C) Local Single Issue Organizations/Activists

There are a large number of animal rights, ecological advocacy groups that operate throughout the territory covered by the Inland Northwest. The majority of these groups do not promote violence or other criminal activity. Likewise, members of most of these groups engage in non-violent, protest activity as protected by the Constitution. However, there are a number of local activists often times affiliated with a number of local organizations that are known to engage in civil disobedience, vandalism, and/or other criminal activity in order to advance their radical single issue agendas. These activists often have criminal records, with prior arrests by federal, state, or local law enforcement agencies on charges ranging from police obstruction to assault. Several local activists that have engaged in criminal activity are identified below.

Peace activists arrested in US Congressman's office

Washington, USA: Eight peace activists were arrested on 3 April while waiting in the lobby of US Representative George Nethercutt's office in Spokane, Washington. The activists were waiting to speak with Nethercutt about their concern regarding the current US administration's so-called war on terrorism after their letter requesting a meeting was refused. The activists were informed that Nethercutt, who has never in his six years as a Congressman honored a request to meet with members of the Spokane peace community, was "unavailable" and would not be able to meet with them. A short time later, however, a "red-faced and obviously angry" Nethercutt was escorted into his office by armed officers, said Paddy Inman, Peacekeeper Coordinator for School of the Americas Watch (SOAW) and one of those arrested. Each of the activists read a personal statement to Nethercutt expressing their distress towards the pervasive and escalating violence in the world today. Shortly thereafter, the activists were handcuffed and arrested.

The activists arrested included the co-directors of the Peace and Justice Action League of Spokane (PJALS) and other long-time peace advocates. All eight were realeased and are due for a hearing in Federal District Court sometime in the future.

Fairchild AFB OSI received information about a protest that is scheduled to take place early Thursday morning (6:45am) at the main gate of the base. The protest is being kept secret by members of the Peace and Justice Action League of Spokane (PJALS). PJALS has arranged to have the activity videotaped by law students. A briefing of several law enforcement agencies is planned to discuss traffic and enforcement issues on dealing with the protesters.

Det. said the protest coordinated by the Peace and Justice Action League of Spokane (PJALS) at Fairchild AFB two weeks ago started before 7am and ended shortly thereafter with several arrests. Due to law enforcement preparedness, the protesters were taken by surprise and very little disruption was felt at the base.
