John Doe F; as individuals and on behalf of others similarly situated (collectively "Plaintiffs") for a temporary restraining order.

Having considered Plaintiffs' motion and all pleadings submitted in support of and in opposition to the motion, the requirements of CR 65, as well as the arguments of counsel for the parties, the Court FINDS:

- 1) Plaintiffs have a clear legal and equitable right to enjoin the release of exempt records to the general public, as the disclosure would cause immediate and irreparable harm and would not be in the public interest. Plaintiffs have shown a likelihood of prevailing on the merits of their claims.
- 2) Plaintiffs have a well-grounded fear of immediate invasion of their rights.
  Plaintiffs' ability to seek injunctive relief would be meaningless if the registration records of Plaintiffs and other members of the proposed Class were released prior to a determination on the merits.
- Plaintiffs have shown that the WASPC's anticipated release would result in substantial and irreparable injury.

The Court therefore ORDERS that Plaintiffs' Motion for a Temporary Restraining Order is GRANTED; WASPC shall not disclose or disseminate any records or information pertaining to level I sex offenders, except as permitted by RCW 4.24.550. This temporary

1	restraining order remains effective until the Court rules on Plaintiffs' Motion for a
